



Some Other Annoying Behaviors

Unnecessary use of a laptop in class

Meet with your academic advisor every semester!




The allowed 18 credits isn't much more work than 15 credits (it's just one more class).



Structure of a Bachelor's Degree

- General Education
- College Requirements (BA students)
- Major Requirements
- Courses Supporting the Major
- Minors, electives and other



120 credits total; 45 of which must be upper-level (300+) credits

New Federal regulations <u>require</u> Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) policy changes:

Students receiving Federal Financial Aid MUST meet 3 standards of progress

- Qualitative (min cumulative GPA)
- Quantitative (min completion rate)
- Max credits (funds ONLY up to 150% completion-180 credit hours)

Students can APPEAL any decision of ineligibility
