ON-CAMPUS HOUSING FOR 2013-2014

Housing Selection

- Application was available February 4-8
- Eligibility
 - Current on-campus residents returning as full-time undergraduates
 - Spring 2013 is 6th or fewer semester on-campus
- Groups of 6, 4, 3, & 2 have already selected
- Individuals will select March 21-22
- All students who select must pay their own \$300 non-refundable deposit to confirm their space

Housing Guarantee

- Mason has adjusted its housing policy to a two year guarantee to more realistically and effectively serve our students.
- Demand to participate in Housing Selection exceeds the supply of beds available to be selected, even with our rapid expansion.
- Some students were waitlisted for Housing Selection.
- We will continue to prioritize finding housing for these students. We anticipate being able to house everyone from the Housing Selection waitlist for 2013-2014.

Housing Selection - Waitlist

- Initially, ~350 students were told they are on the waitlist.
 - Groups and individuals with the highest average seniority
- ~75-100 will be brought back into the Housing Selection process for individual selection.
 - Received notification in the past week if they are selecting
 - Will receive selection instructions on March 15
 - Individual selection is March 21-22. Deposit due March 27.
- Remaining waitlist students will submit housing preferences and deposit April 1-5.
 - Have priority to receive housing as spaces open up over the summer.
 - Many students will decide to live off-campus, others will wait to receive placement. Anticipate completing placement in August.
 - No guarantee they will be placed in their preferred room-type/location.

The Waitlist

- Students waitlisted from Housing Selection have priority to receive space.
- May 2nd at 10am waitlist opens up for other eligible students
 - Must be full time undergraduate for 2013-2014
 - These students will be placed after all remaining Housing Selection students are placed.
 - They are not guaranteed an assignment.
 - Will pay \$300 deposit when submit application.
- Incoming transfer students have a separate application and waitlist.

Room Change Requests

- Students who selected during Housing Selection who want to change their assignment may submit a request in June.
 - Application Available June 3 28
 - Priority deadline June 14
- Changes will be made on a space available basis.
- Person for Person Swaps
 - Students who want to swap with another student may submit paperwork at any time over the summer
 - Must swap officially, even if it is just bedrooms within a suite. We must have accurate records of who is assigned to each room to ensure the safety of all residents.

What is your budget? Before you start searching for off-campus housing, you need to evaluate how much you can afford to spend on housing and related expenses. A great first step is filling out a budget worksheet. Keep in mind which items are fixed costs (must haves you cannot change) and which costs are discretionary (you can change if and how much to spend on these categories)

- What is the length or term of the lease?
- What utilities are included?
- How much is the security deposit (and what do I have to do to get it back)
- How many parking spaces are included?
- Payment with one check or multiples?
- Is there a maintenance person on call 24/7?
- What is not allowed?

Signing a Lease

Language in Lease	What to Look for Before Signing
Lease Term	How long you are under contract
Rent and Charges	Amount and where to pay it
Liability Insurance	Are you required to purchase
Release of Resident	What are the terms for me to end and the landlord to end as well
Resident Replacement and Subletting	Is this allowable under the contract
Multiple Residents	Who is responsible for obligations (all or one individual)
Security Deposit	What are the deductions listed

What it Means to Sign


- You read it, understand it and agree to it
- If there is any difference between lease and conversation, what is written controls it (Get it in writing!)

Move-in and Move-out


- Many have check-lists of current conditions
- Take pictures of any and all details
- Schedule walk through five days within moving in and three days within moving out



The cost comparison for purchase vs rental

Purchase

- 7 piece bedroom set \$703
- 5 piece living room set \$708
- 5 piece dinette set \$129

Total cost of furniture: \$1,539

Rental

- Monthly Furniture Rental \$99
- Damage Waiver 12% \$12
- Total Monthly Charges \$111

Annualized Rental and Waiver - \$1,331



The cost comparison for purchase vs rental

Purchase Delivery Costs

- 1 day local truck rental- \$230
- 1 night hotel stay \$129
- Gas at 15 mpg \$4.00/gallon \$27
- Tolls \$10
- Refreshments and pizza to keep moving team moving - \$45
- Total move in: \$441
- Total move out: \$441
- Total Cost \$2,422

Rental Delivery Costs

\$195 – delivery and pick up fee

Total cost of delivery & Furniture: \$1,526



The cost comparison for purchase vs rental

Time Spent - Purchase

- Time Shopping 12 hours
- Assembly time 22 hours
- Day off taken to handle the move 8 hours
- Drive Time to and From rental truck firm 2 hours
- Total Hassle as measured by hours of aggravation required: 44
- Value of your time? \$100/hour
- Total cost of time: \$4,400
- Total Furniture Purchase plus Hassle Costs: \$8,362

Time Spent - Rental

- 1 hour
- Value of your time \$100/hour
- Total cost of time \$100

- Total cost of delivery & Furniture: \$1,626
- **TOTAL SAVINGS: \$6,736**
