The Impact of Your Gift

Gifts to the Parents Fund allowed University Life to implement a number of innovative opportunities to keep students safely involved in the Mason community and to provide key resources aimed at prioritizing student health and well-being.

Unpaid Internship Scholarships

The ongoing impacts of the pandemic forced many financially disadvantaged students to choose between pursuing a valuable resume-building unpaid internship or keeping a job unrelated to their career goals to pay the bills. University Career Services provided 20 scholarships to students completing unpaid internships, including Samiha, who interned with the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of American History.

Outdoor Adventure Tents

As many opportunities for exercise, recreation, and leisure were taken away due to COVID-19 restrictions, Outdoor Adventures became an even more important on-campus resource for students to utilize to escape in a safe environment. Since students could no longer safely share rented tents, eight one-person tents were purchased to ensure students could still take advantage of the great outdoors safely.



Tea Kettles for Quarantine

Residential students relocated to quarantine were not able to access kitchen facilities during their stay. To ensure students had access to hot liquids to make tea, soups, and coffee to aid in their recovery, Student Health Services purchased 30 electric tea kettles for students to use, thus improving students' quality of life while in quarantine.



Corner Pocket Equipment

In an effort to continue offering students the opportunity to safely engage with their peers on campus, Corner Pocket, the campus game room, purchased additional gaming consoles to respond to the growing community on campus interested in connecting virtually through esports.

2020 Parents Fund Grants

A portion of money raised in the Parents Fund was allocated three times in 2020 to support strategic initiatives within the George Mason University community that enhance the student experience.

\$27,826 was allocated to 13 projects across the university community via Parents Fund grants 2,882 students were impacted by projects receiving funding from Parents Fund grants
