Using Your Benefits at Mason

ALL STUDENTS | ALL BENEFITS

Must submit a <u>Veterans Registration Reporting Form</u> (<u>VRRF) EVERY SEMESTER</u> after enrolling in classes or after making changes to existing class schedule.

• **DEADLINE:** No later than 5 pm the first day of classes or you will receive a late fee (\$125)

Section 702 Veterans Access, Choice and Accountability Act of 2014

Allows veterans and dependents <u>using Ch. 30,Ch.31,Ch.</u> 33, or Ch. 35 to pay no more than in-state tuition

Does not change domicile status to "in-state"

702 students are not eligible for Virginia scholarships and grants or out-of-state scholarships and grants

Should only be used by students who cannot be granted in-state tuition rates through SCHEV guidelines

Section 702

Eligibility

Veterans <u>living in Virginia</u> with 90+ days active service

Dependents <u>living in Virginia</u> using benefits transferred from...

- a veteran with 90+days active service
- an active duty service member

Survivors <u>living in Virginia</u> using the Marine Gunnery Sergeant John David Fry Scholarship

Using Section 702

Verify Eligibility

• Student must be actively using Ch. 30, Ch 31, Ch. 33, or Ch. 35

Submit 702 OS waiver application

Section 702 requests are initiated on the VRRF

Submit Documentation

- Dead, Lease or other proof
- COE

Veterans should use SCHEV guidelines for in-state tuition rates

Important Notes:

Tuition and fees are based on percentage (%) of eligibility

VA covers your percentage at the <u>instate rate only</u>.

The Yellow Ribbon program can assist in cost difference between in-state and out-of-state if requirements are met.

| Percentage of Eligibility | What the VA should cover |
|---------------------------|---------------------------------------|
| 100% | 100% of the in-state tuition and fees |
| 90% | 90% of the in-state tuition and fees |
| 80% | 80% of the in-state tuition and fees |
| 70% | 70% of the in-state tuition and fees |
| 60% | 60% of the in-state tuition and fees |
| 50% | 50% of the in-state tuition and fees |
| 40% | 40% of the in-state tuition and fees |

Yellow Ribbon Program

Used as needed

Must be 100% eligible and Out-of-State Domiciled to be eligible Maximum of \$10,000 per academic year (Fall, Spring, Summer) Unlimited number of slots/students Click the New YR or Continuing YR applicant Goes directly into students account

Covers the Difference

 What you need in your first semester will be used to cover your tuition difference.

Remainder Rolls

• The remaining amount will be available for the following semester.

Annual Reset

• Each fall, the money renews back to \$10,000.

Housing Stipend

Important Notes:

Paid directly to you (the student)

Based on percentage (%) of eligibility and credits taken

Undergraduates must have <u>at least 7 credits</u> to receive any stipend

Graduates must have <u>at least 5 credits</u> to receive any stipend

**For summer term rates, please contact our office. MHA requires monthly verification!!!!!


Chapter 30: Montgomery GI Bill

Payments

 Pays a stipend to the student; does not cover tuition and fees

Rates as of October 1, 2023

- Full-time \rightarrow \$2,358.00/month
- $^{3}/_{4}$ time \rightarrow \$1,768.50/month
- $\frac{1}{2}$ time to more than $\frac{1}{4}$ time \rightarrow \$1,179.50/month
- $\frac{1}{4}$ time or less \rightarrow \$ 589.50/month



Chapter 35: Dependents Education Assistance (DEA) Program

Stipend only

Does Not Cover Tuition

Payments

- Full time → \$1,488.00/month
- $\frac{3}{4}$ time \Rightarrow \$1,176.00/month
- $\frac{1}{2}$ to > $\frac{1}{4}$ Time \rightarrow \$862.00/month
- $\frac{1}{4}$ time or less \rightarrow \$372/month

May be eligible for the Virginia Military and Survivor Dependent Education Assistance Program

Chapter 1606: Montgomery GI Bill - Selective Reserves

Institutional Training

• Pays a stipend to the student; does not cover tuition and fees

Rates as of 1 Oct 2023

- Full-time → \$466/month
- $\frac{3}{4}$ time \Rightarrow \$349/month
- $\frac{1}{2}$ time \rightarrow \$233/month
- Less than $\frac{1}{2}$ time \rightarrow \$116.50/month

Federal Tuition Assistance

\$250 per credit hour, up to \$4,500 per academic year

When (Deadline)

• The first day of classes

Example <u>out-of-pocket</u> costs for in-state students

Not including course-specific fees.

| Credits | Tuition + MSF | TA | Out-of-Pocket |
|----------------------|---------------|------------|---------------|
| 1 | \$542.25 | \$250.00 | \$292.25 |
| 6 | \$3,253.50 | \$1,500.00 | \$2,503.50 |
| 12-16 (flat rate) | \$6,507.00 | \$3,000.00 | \$3,507.00 |

FERPA

not the same as Authorized User in the Payment System

- The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) is a federal law that governs the education records of eligible students. It grants students continuous access to their education records upon request, allows students to amend their records if they feel they're inaccurate, and restricts how and when their education records can be disclosed.
- When a student turns 18, or attends a postsecondary institution, FERPA rights belong to the student, not the parent.
- Mason does not release non-directory information unless a student has provided consent, the release is to the parent of a dependent student, as required by § 23.1-1303.B.5 of the Code of Virginia, or the disclosure meets a qualified exception under FERPA.
