

Whether your student is living on or off campus, remind them to become familiar with their best routes to and from George Mason. For some students, being prepared for the first day of class could involve purchasing a parking permit or learning a bus or Metrorail route. Encourage your student to create an account at **masoncommutes.com** if they are interested in riding with others who are traveling at the same time and to the same destination.
